[00:00:00] **Frank Gaffney:** Welcome to this jointly sponsored briefing on the UN Runs amok. I'm Frank Aney. I am a member of the Victory Coalition sponsored by our Institute for the American future. We are joined as we have the privilege of being for many of these programs by, Pesic Wiki, the executive director of our co-sponsor, the Israel 365 Action Program.

[00:00:42] He will be speaking in a moment, and I want to just simply say by way of introduction to the entire company, this is a moment when the world's eyes are. Reportedly on New York City [00:01:00] where the UN General Assembly is hosting what are known as world leaders, including some who genuinely are notably President Donald J.

[00:01:12] Trump of the United States, who spoke powerfully from the rostrum there in New York, earlier in the week, and assorted others, from nations Great and not so great are also making appearances. in their turn. We are focusing, as we do frequently in these Victory Coalition briefings on what is taking place of great importance to the United States and its vital security interests, but also to others.

[00:01:48] Who love, freedom, and seek to assure its survival in an increasingly dangerous world, notably among them. And arguably the one that is [00:02:00] doing certainly per capita the most to fight for freedom at this moment is the state of Israel. We're going to talk about what has transpired in the United Nations General Assembly, meetings of the fall of 2025 to date.

[00:02:19] notably efforts that are being made to, fashion, some kind of Palestinian state out of whole cloth, and to, legitimate an Al-Qaeda leader who spent some time in ISIS, as well, no less. And who now is, running. Increasingly Tyra radically the nation that with the help of the Turks, he has seized that would be at least part of the nation of Syria.

[00:02:54] a lot to cover and some fantastically insightful [00:03:00] participants to help us do I am very grateful to each and every one of them. they have, more or less dropped everything to participate in, this conversation at this moment. And I can't think of a more urgent mission actually at a time when there is much confusion about, the truth concerning the Middle East, what's happening there, notably in Gaza of the stakes, not just for the state of Israel, but for, the region and especially for those of us here in the United States.

[00:03:35] What are the stakes for our country as well? We're going to begin with a recording of a conversation that I had earlier this week with one of the most astute un watchers, certainly in our country. His name is Alex Newman. He is, the proprietor of and, driving force behind Liberty Sentinel, dot org.[00:04:00]

[00:04:00] He has been, published widely in both essays and book length treatments, often involving issues, affecting the culture and our civilization. but a special focus of effort for him has been the United Nations and other, instruments of global governance. we've asked him to set the stage for us.

[00:04:30] For this conversation about what's been going on in the house of the prime mover, arguably behind global governance at the moment, namely the Communist China dominated United Nations. let's go to the videotape of my interview with Alex Newman on our, securing America program. seen on real America's voice.

[00:04:58] Alex Newman: And President Trump has been [00:05:00] very clear going back to when he was first running for office, before his first term, that the United Nations, in fact, he has openly said, is not a friend to the United States of America. It's not a friend to freedom. And so he understands this and he's been taking concrete action to try to protect American interests in the face of a continuing onslaught by the UN to usurp and accumulate more and more power.

[00:05:21] and his speeches at the UN General Assembly have been fairly consistent, an embrace of patriotism, a rejection of globalism. there's no reason to expect that'll be different this time. he has already, announced that we'll be withdrawing from multiple UN agencies, including some of the key ones, the World Health Organization, UNESCO, the UN's, educational, scientific and cultural organization, including almost all of the climate apparatus, so far with the exception of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change.

[00:05:48] And when you look at. What Communist China is doing. And this is not new. I've been reporting on this in the New American magazine and the Epic Times and many other places, for well over a decade. they are trying to strengthen the UN [00:06:00] and build out what they euphemistically called global governance.

[00:06:02] back in the 2013, communist China came together with a bunch of allies and called for what they described as a new world order to live well. they advocated for, turning the UN General Assembly into what they described as an emblem of global sovereignty. In other words, a type of global legislature, because they

understand now the CCP understands now that it has enough influence over enough UN member states that it can call the shots if it can move decision making authority to the general assembly.

[00:06:30] So it's very dangerous and I expect Trump is gonna push back hard.

[00:06:34] **Frank Gaffney:** And this global governance initiative, which was most recently. Declared by Xi Jinping, the dictator of communist China, at the Shanghai Cooperation Organization meeting in Beijing or nearby. he made no bones about the idea that, essentially this is the new world [00:07:00] order, that he and Vladimir Putin and others have been talking up, a multipolar world.

[00:07:07] but in practice, Alex, isn't this really just a new form of. world government with Chinese characteristics.

[00:07:20] Alex Newman: It absolutely is, the CCP talks a lot about socialism with Chinese characteristics. This is world order with Chinese characteristics. They are urging these blocks like the African Union, like the Shanghai Cooperation Organization and others to push back against Donald Trump to further deepen their integration.

[00:07:37] And, this is very dangerous. the people need to look at the history of the CCP and realize if they manage to take charge of the world, it's going to be a very, dangerous place.

[00:07:47] **Frank Gaffney:** The dark place, certainly for people who love freedom, that's for sure. The Chinese have, by some counts, murdered a hundred million of their own people and [00:08:00] enslaved countless others of them.

[00:08:02] Some genocidally like the Uyghurs. people ought to think hard about this if that's how they treat their own people. Do you really think they're gonna treat the rest of us better? And, global governance as an instrument for essentially imposing, Alex, something you and I have been talking about for a while, the sort of control mechanisms, specifically what the Chinese have described as the social credit system based upon things like digital IDs, the World Health Organizations got them for health purposes.

[00:08:42] Some are arguing our own real ID system would lend itself to this as well. Talk a little bit about these instruments of control and how the Chinese are exercising them now building upon, among other things they're colonial. enterprise, the [00:09:00] belt and road initiative.

[00:09:01] **Alex Newman:** Yeah. It's one of the things that's so troubling about what's happening over there.

[00:09:03] Communist China is really the pilot project for how they want to dominate the world in terms of the technological gulag, where everything you do is tracked and

surveilled. There are, biometric data gathering, contraptions everywhere. Including cameras, including microphones. they have. Total access to, absolutely total access to everything on your phone.

- [00:09:23] they can deduct money from your bank account immediately. And this is the model that they intend to push out on the entire world. they've experimented with it in communist China. And, I think one of the big reasons why this is so dangerous, Frank, is because so many would be and want to, elites in the Western world have fully embraced this vision.
- [00:09:42] Whether you're talking about the International Monetary Fund, the European Union, a lot of the national European governments, they have fully embraced this vision. even a lot of corporate executives in the United States. And so this makes the threat far more significant than if it was just the CCP acting on its
- [00:09:57] One of the major developments that's happening, with [00:10:00] and within the United Nations right now is this effort to, set a precedent for international universal jurisdiction for the International Criminal Court. and we see it right now most clearly in the assault on the state of Israel.
- [00:10:13] Now, the state of Israel has not ratified the Rome statute. They are not, they have never agreed to be bound by the International criminal court, which of course respects none of the traditional notions of rights that we have in the Western world. The presumption of innocence, the right to a trial by jury, and, I could go on,
- [00:10:28] And yet, with support from the, Marxist regime in South Africa, which is a very close ally of the CCP and plenty of other governments around the world, the ICC is now seeking to bring in Benjamin Netanyahu, the Prime Minister and other senior officials from Israel on, international criminal charges, including, crimes against Humanity and others.
- [00:10:45] now people need to understand that this would lay the precedent for eventually bringing in people like Donald Trump, and they're working on this right now. Very quietly, I've received information from sources at, very high levels within the United Nations, that there is an effort to [00:11:00] try to lay out a legal case against Donald Trump himself.
- [00:11:02] just a few months ago, you and I, Frank talked about the International Court of Justice. the UN likes to think of it as the World Supreme Court. they issued a tremendously important ruling. In fact, many analysts called it one of the most important court rulings in the history of the world and what this kangaroo court found.
- [00:11:19] Is that every government in the world has a legal obligation under international law and international human rights law, which elevates this to a whole new level to combat the alleged climate crisis by reigning in and suppressing emissions of carbon dioxide. The gas we exhale. Of course, Donald Trump has done exactly the opposite.

- [00:11:38] He has, basically waged war against this narrative that human emissions of CO2 are, dangerous for the climate. He's waged war against the machinery to make that possible. And so all of this leads us right back to the Communist Chinese effort to redefine human rights, to use human rights as a mechanism for stealing freedom rather than protecting freedom.
- [00:11:59] And ultimately [00:12:00] for, taking down anybody who resists this move toward a world order, very much including President Trump and some of the key people in his administration. we're facing a full on onslaught, not just against our country, but against liberty itself.
- [00:12:14] **Frank Gaffney:** And, you've tumbled across, some indications that they're trying to institutionalize all of this in new arrangements in the Hague. that would give additional power, to, the various international courts there to, to prosecute President Trump, is that right?
- [00:12:36] **Speaker 2:** Yes. the UN Development Program put out a press release recently and it, was hardly picked up by the development program.
- [00:12:43] **Alex Newman:** Yes, it's a very strange agency to be working on this project, but I understand there are multiple members of, secretary General's on, Antonio Gutierrez's personal staff working on this initiative. it is, the. UN DP office for the Innovation of Justice. [00:13:00] They call it a Justice Futures co-lab.
- [00:13:02] And, they have the co-director of the NDPs Governance Rule of Law and Peace Building Hub. They have the, crisis bureau, the Bureau for policy and program support, all working within this to try to innovate on international justice issues. some of the key people involved, will be very familiar to people who follow the United Nations and what it does.
- [00:13:21] You've got, Gati Wally. She's the, first Arab African woman to lead the UN office at the, Vienna office on drugs and crime. You've got, and by the way, they, right now have, former Filipino President Rodrigo Duterte, sitting in a jail cell in the Hague on charges of fighting the drug war too vigorously.
- [00:13:39] another individual is, Maher Nassar. He spent, 37 years working at the unhe is the, commissioner General. he served as the Commissioner General at the UN Expo 2025 in Osaka. Then you have, Felipo Gari, who is the, high Commissioner for refugees, which is another one of the big lines of assault on Donald Trump, that he's violating [00:14:00] international law by not opening up the borders to anybody who claims to be a refugee.
- [00:14:04] So all of these people are working on this. it's extremely dangerous. I've informed, key people, Donald Trump, working on this, meaning basically making cases against President Trump and his,

- [00:14:14] they, are trying to lay out, a legal framework for coming after, Trump and people like him in the future, who resist this effort to, globalize governance, put the CCP model in place at the international level.
- [00:14:28] **Frank Gaffney:** And, former President Duterte of the Philippines, how is it that he. Was served up by the government of the Philippines, I imagine, to stand trial in the ha.
- [00:14:39] Alex Newman: Yeah. and so this is really interesting. The, only time, he ever came across my desk, I ended up writing an article about him in the New American a few years ago because he was very critical of the United Nations.
- [00:14:49] He was actually saying maybe the Philippines should leave the un. This is a disgraceful organization, and how dare they tell us how we can govern here in the Philippines. and so with the cooperation of other governments, with [00:15:00] the cooperation of authorities, in various places, we saw him arrested and transported to the Hague.
- [00:15:05] And, by the way, they're laying the groundwork to do this right now to Benjamin Netanyahu. multiple governments have said if he steps foot in their country, he will be arrested and he will be, flown to the Hague. this is not some far off thread long into the future. I know people think, Donald Trump will just laugh with him.
- [00:15:22] In fact, he imposed sanctions on the ICC, which they richly deserved. But things can change very rapidly and these people are playing the long game.
- [00:15:30] **Frank Gaffney:** it could change very rapidly, particularly if there's a successor administration that would be only too happy, precise to serve him up, to stand trial in a way that, they weren't able to, secure at least convictions, in the United States.
- [00:15:43] Frank Gaffney Alex Newman, thank you for laying the predicate for what is afoot here in terms of a un running amok. I especially appreciate the overlay of what the Chinese Communist Party is doing in its increasingly, not just influential, [00:16:00] but I think determinative role. There and we're going to drill down Now how all of this bears.
- [00:16:07] we've heard reference made, at several points there by Alex to, prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu of Israel and what the global governance crowd, would love to do to him personally, but also to his country. and I don't know of anybody better to help us, connect. Some dots, from the United Nations all the way over to the Holy Land.
- [00:16:29] then our co-sponsor for this briefing, our friend Rabbi Pesic Wiki, as I mentioned, he runs, the partner in these briefings, Israel 365 action. He is a podcaster of, considerable renowned, it's called Shoulder to Shoulder. He's also a

columnist for the Jerusalem Post, and I want to, especially to commend to all of you, the really terrific videos that he produces, quite regularly, and makes available on this platform, [00:17:00] Israel 365 action.

[00:17:01] they, Fill in very nicely between our various briefings, which we very much appreciate doing with him and his team. Rabbi, thank you for joining us. happy New Year to you, sir. I noted in our press release for this event, it may be a new year for the Jews, but it's, same o for an organization, the United Nations that seems to hate the Jews. Over to you, sir.

[00:17:25] Rabbi Pesach Wolicki: The, United Nations. There was a great rabbi of the, last generation who commented that. It seems that God brought the United Nations into existence in order to found the state of Israel. And ever since then, it's been completely useless or worse. it was probably the one righteous act that was ever done in the United Nations.

[00:17:45] the, look, the big headline outta the United Nations this week is all of these western nations, Australia, United Kingdom, France, Canada, probably missing a few who are now stepping up and saying that they, that they [00:18:00] recognize a Palestinian state. And, recognition of a Palestinian state by United Nations members is no new thing.

[00:18:06] Going all the way back to 2012, I think something like 139, member states of the United Nations, recognized the Palestinian state and of course that didn't, wish it into existence. I wanna address that issue, the Palestinian state issue and give, anyone watching this. and, if you're watching it live or on recording, some talking points that you can use around the water cooler or, or at home, when people bring up this issue of a Palestinian state.

[00:18:33] But before I get to that, let's just comment on what's happening right now and why they're doing this. We've talked in the past Frank many times about how this is really a spiritual war, and there is a, this war. What the Victory Coalition is all about is combating the war that is being waged by the, Red Green Alliance, [00:19:00] by this merger of, global, Marxist tyranny and, Sharia supremacy, Islamic Jihadism, whatever you want to call it.

[00:19:11] Their number one enemy for both of them is Israel. What they really are is a triumph of falsehood. And the, narrative, of Palestinian national identity, which Israel has been complicit, admittedly, in allowing it to take hold, is really a, we all know that it's an utter falsehood. it has no historical basis whatsoever.

[00:19:37] There is no, right of, of self-determination of any kind of Palestinian people. The entire thing is a fiction. most of the countries in the Middle East are, just lines drawn on a map after World War I. Anyway, there's no these nationalities, not just the Palestinian nationality, but many of the quote unquote nationalities.

[00:19:55] Jordanian, Iraqi, a number of them in the Middle East are really just, are [00:20:00] modern, fictions that don't reflect reality. The, and obviously this is

happening now because the world is in a panic. they're in a panic over the fact that Israel is actually, finally after October 7th with some measure of waking up, is finally calling a spade and not willing to, to go along with the lies and not willing to go along with the narratives of our enemies.

- [00:20:24] And this is sending everyone into an absolute panic of what's gonna happen, after Israel, finishes. If they do finish, hopefully, I dunno what finishing looks like. That's a, that's all. Other question, maybe for a different webinar, what does ending the war actually look like? but.
- [00:20:40] this whole call for a Palestinian state thing now at the, what seems to be on the face of it, the most inopportune time. there isn't even, there's a war going on, is obviously just an effort to, to, to delegitimize Israel and keep the hope of destroying Israel alive.
- [00:20:56] So I, what I assembled here is five very basic [00:21:00] questions that one could ask their interlocutor, who might be in favor of a two-state solution, just to, to show how absurd the whole concept actually is. Question number one, keeping in mind that the Palestinian authority has not held elections in 20 years since January of 2006.
- [00:21:24] And keeping in mind that polling, even polling as recently as May, 2025, Palestinian polling, meaning there's a Palestinian center, for, they call it the Palestinian Center for. Survey and policy research is based in Ramala and their polling, shows as of May, 2025, just a few months ago, that Hamas is still ahead in the polls.
- [00:21:48] We're an election to be held today. So the question to ask is, if you're in favor of a Palestinian state, do you want this Palestinian state to be a democracy? Do you want it to have free and fair elections? [00:22:00] Do you want the... When Palestinians were polled? Do they want the Palestinian authority to govern the Gaza Strip when the war is over? 56% said no.
- [00:22:15] As recently as May, 2025, in the same poll, they were asked if there was a head-to-head election between Mahmoud Abbas, the current head of the Palestinian Authority, and Colored Mical, the head of the political Bureau of Hamas. Michelle would win 68 to 25 with the rest undecided. An overwhelming landslide for Hamas.
- [00:22:40] So anyone who says they believe in a Palestinian state has to face the question of do they want it to actually have free and fair elections? Question number two, you say that Hamas cannot be in a governing role. All of the, governments that have issued these statements of recognition of [00:23:00] a fictional Palestinian state, if you read through their statements, they all pay lip service to the idea that Hamas can no longer have a governing role.
- [00:23:08] Hamas has to be removed. That we all agree upon. Okay. these statements also all call for Israel to end the war. So if Hamas cannot remain in a

governing role, what is the plan to disarm and remove Hamas from power in Gaza? Because in that same poll.

- [00:23:29] In the same poll that I just cited to you, and this is shocking the Palestinian people were asked, do you support or oppose the disarmament of Hamas in the Gaza Strip to stop the war? Very simple question. Think about that question. we hear about how the Palestinians are suffering and, this, fake starvation narrative and they're being displaced, and how Hamas is actually, is actually a, [00:24:00] tyrannical regime that we need to, liberate the people of Gaza from.
- [00:24:04] So they were asked a simple question, do you want Hamas to disarm as a step towards ending the war? An overwhelming majority said no. 85% of Palestinians in the West Bank and 64% of Gazans said that they are opposed to Hamas disarming to end the war. They were also asked if they support or oppose the eviction of Hamas military leaders from the Gaza Strip as a condition for stopping the war.
- [00:24:37] 65% said that they oppose it. In other words, the people of Gaza, the Arabs of Judea and Samaria, what's known as the Palestinians, are opposed to Hamas being disarmed and to Hamas military leaders being removed from the Gaza Strip. So to those proponents of a two-state solution who are yapping in the [00:25:00] un, what is their plan to remove Hamas, as they all say, is a necessary precondition to a Palestinian state?
- [00:25:08] Question number three. All of these statements, Canada, Australia, all say that this Palestinian state needs to be demilitarized. What do you mean by demilitarized? Will this Palestinian state controlled their own security at all? Are they going to be trusted to fight terrorism? Is there any plan to have to enforce that?
- [00:25:32] How is Israel's safety to be, secured? Just last week on September 19th, the IDF discovered and destroyed a terror cell in Ramallah. That's in Judea, border of Judea Samaria. It's in Benjamin. It was manufacturing short range rockets to attack Israeli civilians. The Palestinian authority didn't do anything about it.
- [00:25:54] The IDF had to, so you who called for a Palestinian state, do you believe that they should have [00:26:00] control of their own security? And if not, how independent do you believe the state should be? Question four. Do you believe that the Palestinian state that you are recognizing should have control of its own education system?
- [00:26:14] If so, how do you propose to make sure that they've stopped using curricular materials that call for Israel's destruction and for genocide against Jews? This is why we have two generations of Arabs, of Palestinians, of Arabs from the West Bank and Gaza who have, been fully indoctrinated in this genocidal jihadist ideology.
- [00:26:35] So in your Palestinian state that you are recognizing, do you believe that they should have control of their own education system? And if not, who should be

controlling their education system? What's your plan? Question five and the final one. If it's so important to have a Palestinian state in the territory of Judea, Samaria, and Gaza, why didn't the leaders of Egypt and Jordan create this Palestinian state between [00:27:00] 1948 and 1967?

- [00:27:03] When Israel had not yet even taken these territories and they were in Arab hands. So how come there was no push for a Palestinian state then? And the answer is obvious because nobody wants a two-state solution. Nobody wants it. In the same poll that I've been quoting throughout my remarks, Palestinians were asked if they support a solution.
- [00:27:23] 57% said no. They do not support a two state solution. So this whole two state solution talk in the United Nations is performative com entirely performative. It will have no impact on the reality on the ground. Its sole purpose is to demonize the state of Israel and tie Israel's hands and make it much more difficult for there to be other solutions that could actually bring peace and prosperity to everyone in the region, Israelis and Arabs alike.
- [00:27:57] **Frank Gaffney:** The extraordinarily important summation of [00:28:00] the various problems with this notion of a Palestinian state building upon the general problem. Of course, that there isn't such a thing we're gonna hear next from one of America's preeminent experts on the Middle East and on national security policy.
- [00:28:20] More broadly. His name is Dr. David Wurmser. He is no stranger to these programs. In fact, we've been the beneficiary of his insights in, I think, all of our briefings from the inception of the Victory Coalition for which we are very, grateful. David has served in senior positions in the State Department, the National Security Council, and the Office of the Vice President of the United States.
- [00:28:43] He is, these days a senior analyst and the director for the Mideast programs of the Center for Security Policy. Dr. Wurmser, thank you again for your time and your tremendous expertise, not least on the role the [00:29:00] United Nations has played. I think it practically from the moment that it made that one, good deed, the mitzvah, of facilitating the creation of the state of Israel, to the present moment, unbroken, pretty much hostility to the Jewish state.
- [00:29:17] talk to us about, what you make of what has happened to date at the UN General Assembly, and what it portends, sir,
- [00:29:23] **David Wurmser:** two things to refer to cartoons. they tie back to what Rabbi pe, said. the first is there used to be a cartoon in the fifties in Israel by a, cartoonist. His name was Dash.
- [00:29:35] And, every time Doug ERs Guild, who was the, then the Secretary General of the UN would come to visit, to mediate the peace processes back in the fifties. he would draw a picture. In the newspaper of, the Israeli, political structure taking shelter inside a, inside a, an air raid shelter.

- [00:29:57] And it was called the UN Shelter. So [00:30:00] basically that, that is the relationship to the un Israels had all along. It's whenever they convene, it's essentially an attack that requires some defense, to look at what's happening. Now, I refer to a second cartoon by a guy named, Kirs, who was a dry bones, is known more common, and he once had this little, series of pictures.
- [00:30:21] And the first was a, guy was dreaming and, he, he saw that, so and so was talking and so on. And then the fi second to the last frame was, and, it has left ABBA Ban, Israel's foreign minister speechless. And then there was a pause, and then he looks at the screen and he goes. That's too much, even for a dream.
- [00:30:44] the what is happening right now in the UN is breathtaking. It is almost, it almost leaves you speechless because what is the utter collapse of Western civilization, elite collapse of the defense of Western civilization. Not [00:31:00] only do we see it on the streets of Britain with the flag revolt and the attempt to suppress it, and the arresting of people for speaking out, failure to defend against Islam in the cities, et cetera, et cetera.
- [00:31:12] But we see it at the un where there's simply, you no longer see any reference to the hostages. You no longer see any reference to what happened on October 7th. You see no reference to the larger question here of Israel's security and legitimacy. They're going for the jugular. That Israel is no longer legitimate, and you're seeing an increasing tolerance of that view by elites in the West, many of whom are in power, and, so there really is almost no answer to that.
- [00:31:42] Now, why is this happening? I think Alex had a, is onto something. It's something Lee Smith also has, touched upon. So I don't wanna pilfer his idea without giving him credit. Alex thinks it's that one of the central issues is to take over the [00:32:00] UN and I think it is, by China. I think with Israel, Lee thinks the Israel portion of it is a diversion to tie down the west and throw sand in the eyes of the west while the Chinese move ahead more centrally to destroy the west.
- [00:32:18] I don't think that's exclusive. Those, views are really exclusive. but I think it's very important to note. The reason why I say it is because I don't think we're fully appreciating how much Israel has become a central player. On one level, in the Chinese American fight, we can go through these various strategic analyses of Qatar, Pakistan, verse India, the belt and road, turkeys and Turkey.
- [00:32:45] A NATO ally is aligned very tightly with China on this, tur, KA Qatar, who's, con considered a major non-NATO ally, is also very aligned with China. The whole structure, strategically, they're trying [00:33:00] to create with Iran, with Pakistan, and is, really, a belt and road initiative structure.
- [00:33:08] But laying that aside, there's something much more central. And that's what happened in June with Iran. What Israel did was not a simple decapitation strike that's been done not much before, but I'd assume it has been done before. What Israel did was reinvent the way war is fought. It is a much smaller country.

- [00:33:31] I think one 10th the population won 35th, the, territory of Iran. Iran is a sophisticated country. The, their military performance should not. Should not teach us that they are basket cases. They are not militarily a basket case. they're not on our standards, but they're not a bad military altogether.
- [00:33:52] Iran is very powerful and Israel not only decapitated it in many ways, [00:34:00] but it paralyzed its command and control structure. It got into the system on how the function of the military operates, the whole command structure, the military operates and it almost made it a virus that destroyed the system itself.
- [00:34:16] We don't know the whole parameters of it, but the Israeli way of war. Fundamentally changed the nature of war and allowed a small country with very limited resources and a much smaller military to neutralize a massive conventional superiority. The other side had, not only that, but Israel showed that this form of war is you're able to cut and paste it.
- [00:34:44] It happened with Lebanon, with Hezbollah, and you could say, they've taken since 2006, 20 years to plan that. And they just did it and, lo and behold and worked because they had such good intelligence, et [00:35:00] cetera. But then you saw them do it with Iran and you can say, they also knew Iran was gonna be the enemy for 20 years and so forth.
- [00:35:07] Then all of a sudden, a, ma, a few weeks ago, they struck Yemen and did the same thing, and in Yemen. Israel admittedly had almost no intelligence a year ago. So this is not only cut and pastable, but it doesn't rely on a 20 year investment of all your nation's resources into intelligence. It's, there's ways they're doing it using intelligence, ai, satellites, technology in addition to human intelligence.
- [00:35:38] Now, why is this important? Because the whole essence of China's strategy in the world is to convince the West that its military superiority is so overwhelming that it is built up so massively. The order of battle is so insurmountable that resistance is funeral. In other words, there's [00:36:00] no war their plan there's no war.
- [00:36:03] The west can plan for The West really only has a choice. Suicide by war. Or surrender before war. that is sun Sue wrote about it, others. That is really what the Chinese military strategy is, to win before there's a war. And along comes Israel and delivers a cut and pastable way of waging war that America can learn and America can implement.
- [00:36:29] And if it does, can completely upturn. The me the conventional superiority that China, is trying to build and, to try to cower the west and to surrender preemptively. so in many ways, Israel stumbled by its way of war, that it is waging in the Middle East into a fundamental threat to the way China has tried to strategically cower the West.
- [00:36:57] And in doing so, I [00:37:00] think the Chinese have marked as one of their most important objectives right now is the tarnishing and taking down of Israel.

because if it's tarnished, if it loses, if it looks awful, then. Nobody's gonna look at how Israel prosecuted the war as a, it ceases to be a model to emulate and then China gets scot-free.

[00:37:23] This is in addition to all the other strategic things. Now, the mechanism to do it is partly on the ground. We see how China's now in Egypt, we see the, HQ nine anti-aircraft system is being deployed to the Sinai in violation of the Peace Treaty. By the way, we see how China is in all over the Middle East.

[00:37:41] But, most importantly, it's how China governs the un, and you're seeing a massive effort at the UN now. Tsunami at the un, using also Qatar Alliance with money, massive amounts of money. You see the deals between Macron [00:38:00] and Qatar and the influence of that, and so on and so forth. It, and that really you begin to see the strategic backdrop for this tsunami.

[00:38:09] Now, where does Macron and, just one note about this whole thing in Gaza and ending Gaza and what he thinks and his plan for a state, Macron actually, his plan has leaked. It is actually to create a un, a massive il. IL is the UN force in Lebanon that essentially was a human shield for Hezbollah for the last 20 years, or, really 40 years, to create a massive IL like force, un based force that will enter Gaza.

[00:38:40] And as it's written, with or without Israeli approval. to take over Gaza, and, that, and to facilitate the creation of a state. And then it goes on to say, but you can't really divide Gaza from Judea and Samaria, the West Bank. so you really need to enter that force also into the West Bank.

[00:38:59] So [00:39:00] what you see here is a un takeover, the laying the foundations of a un takeover. of these territories to create a, Palestinian state. And then you go back to what Alex said, that the Chinese now operate via the UN to pursue their strategic objectives. And now you begin to see the whole backdrop and the whole purpose of this massive tsunami of recognition of the flotilla, the Spanish jumping on board, the Spanish themselves, saying they wish they had power to cower Israel, militarily, in fact even in Israel if necessary.

[00:39:40] So you really begin to see how this operates and really the Chinese are behind it. Why should America care? one is China. That's one of really, if not our primary enemy. But second of all, we keep forgetting the Israel issue is not an Israel issue. It is a Western civilization issue.

[00:39:58] It's the foundation of the [00:40:00] West. Its survival. The way Israel is treated is a reflection on the solidity of the west. So China also understands if you break that, the same thing, the Russian communists understood. If you break. The American commitment to Israel. You break the west because you rip the soul, the founding soul, that old Jerusalem is ripped out of the soul of New Jerusalem, which is America, and, they know without that soul.

[00:40:28] This is something Charlie, Kirk, and others understood too. Without that soul, America doesn't survive. Western civilization doesn't survive. So ultimately

China is both militarily operating, bureaucratically operating international organization, operating. But at the core of it all is a civilizational attack, and the UN has become the central ground for doing.

[00:40:52] **Frank Gaffney:** Dr. Warner, this was a very elegant Philip, to the point that's been made earlier in the program about the spiritual [00:41:00] warfare. The assault on Judeo-Christian civilization is, as you say, right at the core of it. And one of the reasons that I think it's so important to be doing these briefings is, to help connect those particular dots to whatever it is that is taking place at the moment, whether it's in the UN or in the Middle East or elsewhere.

[00:41:21] we're going to turn next to another of our great allies and friends in the Holy Land. His name is Itamar Marcus. He's the founder and president of an indispensable organization there called Palestinian Media Watch. He carefully monitors, through open sources. What it is the Palestinians, whether it's, the Hamas Stripe or the good guys of the Palestinian Authority Stripe, are saying in the media, saying to their own people, saying in the pulpits and, in various other outlets, are there intentions, are there [00:42:00] aspirations, and are there plans?

[00:42:02] and as I think David has mentioned in connection with, some of the polling data, you don't have to look very hard to understand that there is absolutely no appetite for a Palestinian state that will live side by side in peace with Israel. we've asked Edmar to speak to some of these topics and further illuminate for us, why a Palestinian state is and must be a non-starter.

[00:42:32] For not just Israel, but for the rest of us in Judeo-Christian civilization. Over to you, sir.

[00:42:38] **Itamar Marcus:** The great myth, of course, is that the, that the Palestinian authority is moderate and Hamas is the problem. And one of the things that we've been showing for years is that the, Palestinian authority is the fundamental problem.

[00:42:50] I'll go so far as to say Hamas' strength. Today, in, all of the Palestinian areas was created by the Palestinian Authority. The [00:43:00] Palestinian Authority created Hamas as a power. a person grows up under the Palestinian Authority, education, messaging. Israel has no right to exist. Israel must be fought.

[00:43:10] and then when they reach 16, 17, 18, they say, wait a second. Hamas is doing this better than the Palestinian authority. Why Or better than Fatah? Why should I stick with Fatah? And then they joined Hamas and ideologically they were Hamas. Today you have, a Palestinian authority and a Palestinian society.

[00:43:27] Which completely embraces the murder and massacre and, torture, of Jews. you just have to look at the polls immediately after October 7th and continuing today. And I'll, just focus on the polls in Judean Samaria, what the Palestinian polls called the West Bank. and just to give you a sense of what happened.

- [00:43:49] So, just first of all, right before October 7th, in the last poll, fat was twice as strong in popularity as [00:44:00] Hamas. the poll immediately after October 7th, Hamas was three times as strong as fat, and they have remained the stronger force. Today. They're two and a half times as strong as fat. In other words, it was the killing and raping and torturing and burning alive of Israelis that created Hamas' popularity.
- [00:44:20] As long as Hamas was only killing isolated people. They weren't the hero. But as soon as they became that ultimate hero, they become the popular force. Now, it's not just in terms of Hamas, it's, there's been a direct khaki. The most important Palestinian pollster has asked Palestinians since, December 20, 23.
- [00:44:38] Every few months he asks them, was October 7th attack by Hamas the correct decision? And here it gets shocking again. They were talking about West Bank Palestinians, not so these are supposed to be the moderate ones. the first poll December, 2023, a few months after. But everybody knew [00:45:00] about the torture.
- [00:45:00] Every Palestinian knew exactly what happened. 83% said it was the right decision. Now, as the war in Gaza continued, and as the outrageous and exaggerated numbers of deaths of Gaza's were publicized, the polls went down. But even today, the lowest they've reached today, still 59% of Palestinians in the West Bank say that October 7th was the right decision.
- [00:45:28] I, it's just unbelievable. Almost two thirds of Palestinians say, in spite of the belief that they have, that 60,000 Palestinians have been killed by Israel. They still say it was the right decision. Now understand what this means. What they're saying was one day of murder and, one day of superiority over the Jews over Israel where we raped and killed and massacred and took hostages, made 60,000 deaths worthwhile.
- [00:45:57] That's what the West Bank [00:46:00] population is. So you understand the depths of hatred for Israel and of Jews, that the pa that the Palestinian Authority has succeeded in indoctrinating its people with. There was another poll done by a different polling agency. November, 2023, right after, right after.
- [00:46:20] they asked an additional question. They got the same results, 82% said it was the right decision. but they also asked another question. Did the events happening on October 7th until today make you feel proud as a Palestinian? And here we got the real, Palestinian sentiment. 98% of Palestinians said it made them feel proud.
- [00:46:41] and even more shocking. 94% said extremely proud, and 4% said somewhat proud. In other words, it was the, the entire society, the entire Palestinian population, was proud of what happened on October 7th and. [00:47:00] it's shocking because even today when Abba spoke at the un, he said that Hamas didn't represent us in what they did on October 7th.

- [00:47:07] And we disagree with what they did. And of course, it's lies. It absolutely pre represented what the Palestinian authority has been teaching and what they have convinced their population after so many years, they've convinced them that 60,000 deaths is worth it if we can have one day of, superiority, of total superiority over the Jews of Israel.
- [00:47:29] So this is not, now where did this come from? Where did we get to a situation where the Palestinian society, is so hateful, of Israelis and Jews? And I'll get to the, fundamental, is, Palestinian Authority antisemitism Now. This many find shocking because the entire western world, most of the western countries and try to convince themselves or actually believe that this is a territorial war.
- [00:47:58] But when you look at the Palestinian [00:48:00] ideology, listen to what they say. antisemitism is the most dominant, part of Palestinian ideology. And I'll just explain to you why Palestinian antisemitism is literally, a reincarnation of Nazi antisemitism as an ideology, because what they say is that the Jews are the evil force in the entire world.
- [00:48:23] they use expressions like the Jews wanted to subjugate humanity. All the nations of the world suffered from the Jews. everyone wants to get rid of the Jews. They likewise present the protocols of the elders of Zion as the Jewish plan to subjugate all of humanity. this is Palestinian ideology.
- [00:48:38] And then. What do they do with this? They take it to the next step. And they say, the Jews had never had a history in this land, what they call Palestine. why did, why was the Jewish state created? the nations of the world wanted to get rid of the Jews. They had to get rid of the Jews. in one of his speeches, Mah Abbas talked about the Jews being massacred every [00:49:00] couple of decades from the Middle Ages until the Holocaust.
- [00:49:03] And he said, why did this happen? He said, it didn't happen because they were Jews. It happened because of their social role. It happened because of interest. It happened because of et cetera, et cetera, the Jews brought antisemitism on themselves. The Jews brought massacres. The Jews brought the Holocaust on themselves.
- [00:49:16] In another speech, Abbas said, why does Europe, and why did Hitler fight the Jews? And his answer was because they believed, he said, Hitler believed the Jews were causing ruin because of, again, their social role. Jews are so evil that they, yes, they are massacred, but the, nations of the world aren't responsible for those massacres.
- [00:49:39] This is their self-defense against the Jews. Jews are responsible for every massacre. The Jews are responsible for the Holocaust. in a speech at the un, Abbas said that the United States and Britain planted a foreign entity in Palestine so that they could rule it. And then they said, then he added. And they could get rid of their Jews, two [00:50:00] birds with one stone.

- [00:50:01] So this is fundamental. This is the Palestinians need antisemitism. They need antisemitism because they have no explanation for the existence of the Jewish people in Israel, in the land of Israel. without antisemitism. since they say the Jews would never have come here. 'cause we didn't have any history here.
- [00:50:19] Why are we here? this was the world's dumping ground. in one important interview that Palestinian authority did with an expert, and a researcher, a few weeks after October 7th, he was asked, why are so many countries coming and showing sympathy for the Jewish state for Israel? And he said, the nations of the world succeeded in getting rid of their human waste.
- [00:50:42] and they're coming now to strengthen Israel. 'cause they don't want the human waste. to return to their countries. So this is what the conflict is about. It's Palestinian antisemitism. It's Palestinian hatred. It also has to do with territory. But the core is [00:51:00] rejecting any Jewish presence anywhere, any Jewish sovereignty, anywhere.
- [00:51:05] the Jews deserve to be hated and they will continue to expand and expand, on this ideology. in addition to attacking the Jews, they then go and attack the Jewish traditions. They say that the Torah talks of the Torah rewards people for killing Palestinians and for non-Jews. it, it is an entire ideology based on antisemitism.
- [00:51:26] And the world doesn't even begin to touch on this issue 'cause they think it's all about territory. And that's why all of these solutions, that the palace, that the, un, the way the Europeans, everybody's talking about, nothing has any possibility of working until there is. Decades till there are decades of detoxification, of Palestinian hate, ideology and antisemitism.
- [00:51:50] And only then could you possibly begin to talk about having any kind of a, sovereign Palestinian, anything.
- [00:51:58] **Frank Gaffney:** Thank you so much. Imar. [00:52:00] This is, incredibly important level setting on just the fundamental proposition that is, as we've seen in the course of today's conversation, increasingly disconnected from any reality whatsoever.
- [00:52:14] Namely the idea that there can be a Palestinian state that will. Live under any foreseeable circumstances, peacefully as all alongside Israel. Our cleanup matter for today is a man we've often turned to in these briefings. We couldn't be more pleased to have him with us. today he is the newly appointed Chief Executive Officer of the David Horowitz Freedom Center.
- [00:52:37] His name is Daniel Greenfield. he is one of the most, prolific and, I think profoundly, formidable essayists of our time. a, true public intellectual. The author of a number of books, including most recently Domestic Enemies, the Founding Fathers Fight Against the Left. Daniel, thank you so much for finding a few minutes

[00:53:00] for us to, summarize, your own thoughts on this very important, very timely conversation.

[00:53:06] Over to you, sir.

- [00:53:08] **Daniel Greenfield:** So a topic that not everybody has entirely addressed is the reality that the countries that are foremost in advancing this proposal with the un, have their own major crises with Islamic terrorism, with not just Islamic terrorism because that is something that occasionally can be born, but radicalize Islamic populations within their own countries.
- [00:53:28] So the UK, France have a severe crisis in that regard. Canada and Australia have their own crises that have gotten less headlines. And to a large extent, these countries continue to follow the, Notion, the completely fallacious notion that if, they are able to conduct this giveaway, they're able to prop up an Islamic state within Israel.
- [00:53:50] They won't have to worry about their own Palestinian state, their own Islamic state forming and engaging in violence in their own countries because they are not, under any illusions about the. [00:54:00] Violent intensity of Islamic nationalism. they just publicly refuse to acknowledge it or address it or deal with it in many meaningful way.
- [00:54:08] And this has really been the entire argument for a Palestinian state from early on, which was conduct best conducted with international terrorism. give these people their own country, or they're going to hijack airplanes, they're going to set up bombs. they're going to conduct violence across the region and across the world.
- [00:54:24] They're going to take the world hostage. And this was originally a Soviet plan that was carried out for obvious reasons, because the larger goal was to cause chaos and to fracture the relationship between the west and the Muslim world. that relationship, of course, was largely one way. And, we see that more clearly than ever today.
- [00:54:41] as people on this, call have we described China stepped into that? Position, but China is less interested in chaos than the Soviet Union was. The Soviet Union simply wanted to fracture, the bonds of Western societies. The communist China, on the other hand, wants to preserve trade relationships because those are very vital to it.
- [00:54:59] They're [00:55:00] how, China builds influence and finances its operations. At the same time, it wants to undermine American allies to whatever extent the canon wants to undermine the Western world Order. And Israel is a very useful means of doing so. what Russia, what China, what other players have tried to do is, first of all, so division within the West and Israel has been a very useful.

[00:55:20] For means of doing that because it divides western countries, it plays in the divisions between the left and the right. So it's already a net plus for China, for other American enemies of the United States to do that. And of course, if China's able to fracture and weaken Israel, it is, closer to building a hegemony in the Middle East that will not be, American or Western influenced, which of course is something that it wants very much, but would like to do that with a minimum of disruption to trade networks.

[00:55:46] In doing that through the un, doing it the way that, some of the Europeans have proposed with a UN force, again, very helpfully divides the west, just locally amongst citizens who are going to have this debate between, supporting a terrorist state or [00:56:00] opposing it and also dividing, the various countries of the west, against each other.

[00:56:04] So it's very ideal for China's purposes. Now beyond all that, the actual Western countries that are going along with this remain terrified of an Islamic threat, one that they have no actual answer to. we've had the war on terror, which was motivated by this idea that if we bring democracy to the fore, we're going to have better leadership in the Muslim world.

[00:56:26] We're going to repair this, pattern of violence. And of course, that failed badly, as did Obama's, new Middle East, which was motivated by the same idea, except that it was, if you bring these, Islamist, systems to power, they're not going to want to engage in global terrorism anymore.

[00:56:40] And now the defaulting back to the same old idea, which is somehow if you take Israel out of the equation, if you take the Palestinian conflict out of the equation, we're going to have global peace. And that is, of course, entirely delusional. It's snake oil. And there are some people, like macro, I'm pretty sure know that it's snake oil.

[00:56:57] Others are willing to be convinced by it because they're unwilling [00:57:00] to face the real threat, which is the threat of Islam. It's the threat, obviously, of, enemies like China and those threats are too expensive to face because those threats have deep hooks. Deep roots. Now within Western societies, actually decoupling from China, actually standing up to China has a very high price.

[00:57:17] decoupling trying to stand up to the Muslim mode has a very high price as well, especially as Muslim populations continue to increase in Western countries. On the other hand, selling out, Israel has a very low price. All you have to do is jettison the Jewish population, some of the more Christian population, and you suddenly have a great formula.

[00:57:34] It's a very cheap price, and while it doesn't actually solve anything, it creates the illusion of potentially having solved something, which is why they're all enthusiastic about voting, for the city, the un. But there's actually very little interest in doing anything meaningful on the ground. none of these countries are actually

serious about sending forces to invade Israel if they're actually, faced with the prospect of Israel shooting back.

- [00:57:56] However, when it comes to performative actions, then, they're very [00:58:00] enthusiastic about doing this because a big part of this is about pacifying their domestic Muslim populations. The problem is that these domestic Muslim populations are unpersonifiable and they're unpersonifiable worldwide, which is why the response to,
- [00:58:11] The UK prime Minister Starmer's recognition, of the Palestinian state was for the PLO to start talking about reparations because, it's very much a strong horse hors formula. Unless if you show weakness, what you're actually gonna get is more chaos, more violence, more pressure, more intimidation.
- [00:58:28] The impulse then is to push and get as much as possible out of, out of these countries that are choosing to recognize a terrorist state. And the same thing is going to happen to them domestically. By recognizing, terrorism, by recognizing the effectiveness, the efficacy of October 7th abroad, they're guaranteeing that they're going to have an October 7th entry at home.
- [00:58:47] They're guaranteeing that they're going to be more violence in terrorism at home, which is exactly the opposite of what they have in mind. So rather than actually successfully trading Israel for peace with their Muslim populations, what they're actually [00:59:00] doing is they're trading Israel for terrorism and eventually their own version of October 7th.
- [00:59:05] **Frank Gaffney:** Thank you so much. This is, again, a perfect summation, I think, of what has been manifestly documented here, which is, an extraordinary, cynical effort on the part of, people whose own civilization or claim to be part of Judeo-Christian civilization at least, is very much on the line, not just Israel's or for that matter, ours either.
- [00:59:34] we are a little over time. everyone, made such important points that I didn't want you to cut you off. but I think maybe I would just do a quick, a lightning round, to each of you to, just say a few words about, what should we in the team represented by our Victory coalition and, our friends in Israel 365 action.
- [00:59:56] Be pressing for now. [01:00:00] Seeking, our respective elected representatives do now to, try to mitigate the very serious threats that, have just been very, I think, powerfully documented. let's go to the top of the batting order. is, David, would you lead us off, please?
- [01:00:17] **David Wurmser:** I think that at this point, one of the key issues is to make sure very little light of day emerges between Israel and the United States, which is difficult.

- [01:00:25] We just went through the UN and the general Assembly and this festival, which almost looked a bit more like the 1936 Olympics than, than previous, UN meetings. there is a real danger that the desire to end these wars prematurely. And yes, I have some criticism of the Israeli government for having taken so long.
- [01:00:50] But these wars have to end in a dramatic, defeat of these forces, that are arrayed against not only Israel, but the West as a whole. 'cause [01:01:00] if they do not, the pattern that we have seen ever since 1948, really since the twenties of restraining the Israelis don't emerge victorious. It, just lays the seed for the next war.
- [01:01:13] And a lot of warfare in between the wars. In other words, endless war in the worst possible sense, which is exact. But now the Middle East plays such a global role. Israel has this. Larger profile. The United States has less surplus power to throw into the Middle East that these endless wars that result from a lack of decisive Israeli victory, will actually force the United States back in to be bogged down.
- [01:01:42] And that is exactly the strategic objective of our enemies, like China and so forth. So the importance of Israel emerging from Gaza without any cl, without any doubt that they have won dramatically. And [01:02:00] I think the only way to establish that is at least for a while. Sovereignty over Gaza has to be in Israel's hands.
- [01:02:08] It can't be in an international structure. It certainly can't be the Palestinian authority. And yeah, we are hearing about ideas of bringing the Palestinian authority, a technocratic thing, bringing in Qatar, Turkey, or so forth, to, to manage this area. These forces have to be exercised from Gaza, from the West Bank, from Judea and Samaria not invited in.
- [01:02:32] So unless Israel asserts full control, I think that, Israel can't quite emerge from this victorious, and that will be a nightmare for not only Israel, but the United States. and by the way, the same goes for Lebanon. The same goes for Syria. we will wake up one day and realize what a mistake we've made legitimizing Sharah.
- [01:02:52] And if we don't watch out, we're gonna lose Jordan and Egypt very rapidly. We're much closer to war with, Egypt than [01:03:00] people think. So right now, the entirety of avoiding a bogged down endless war in the Middle East rests very much on Israel, emerging from this unquestioningly as the victor.
- [01:03:12] Frank Gaffney: David, thank you, rabbi Pesach Wolicki?
- [01:03:16] **Rabbi Pesach Wolicki:** Dr. Wurmser, when asked what we should do is, speaks about what governments should do, what the West should do, what the powers that be on our side of the football should do. I, don't, I've never advised, people in, positions of authority in the White House as Dr.

- [01:03:33] Wormer has. So when you ask. pe Waki. What we should do, I think about what we have to do in the information warfare space in terms of the people who are being pulled in from within our own camp into these anti-Israel conspiratorial narratives. And what's happened to the right, to the political conservative right in America is very disturbing.
- [01:03:55] And when I think about what we must do when we think globally, and what we've talked [01:04:00] about on this, webinar is not just about the Palestinian state, but contextualizing it in the larger civilizational struggle that we always talk about in the Victory Coalition and in Israel 365 action.
- [01:04:11] What we really need to do is raise more and more awareness in the west, in the Christian West about the dangers of Islam, about of Sharia supremacism, of we have to raise more awareness, about persecution of Christians by Muslims happening all over the world. There, there's an October 7th every month in Nigeria.
- [01:04:36] We need to raise awareness about this. We need the danger of Jihad and Islam and the lies that they tell, and the deception that they pull on the world to become part of the fluency of the parlance of the political discourse on the right. So that, and it'll also benefit Israel because the Israel will then become contextualized as a [01:05:00] front in that larger war against jihad.
- [01:05:02] I think that's a, that's, a, shift that we need to have a kind of framing shift in terms of how we speak about the issue of Israel, that the issue of Israel. can no longer be about Israel. And if we can, really, drum up as it were, the awareness of the threat of Islam more effectively and contextualize Israel that way will make great progress.
- [01:05:24] And also, one thing that we could do, Frank, I'll take the liberties of teeing up Imar Marcus to follow me. Now, if you don't mind, one of the things that we can do is also, especially in these critical moments, in these critical days, is to elevate the work of Palestinian Media Watch of Itamar Marcus's work, which really shows that there is no peace partner.
- [01:05:43] There is no one on the other side to talk to. There is no option of a Palestinian state. So Elevate, go to pal watch.org. I'm giving you a plug. Itamar, I love you Amar's work. I always try to elevate it, but we have to, become fluent in what they are actually saying and who they actually are [01:06:00] and de-legitimize the whole concept from the get go.
- [01:06:02] So I'm gonna, I'm gonna pass it on to Itamar.
- [01:06:06] **Frank Gaffney:** I do the same at every opportunity. Itamar, thank you for all these contributions, your thoughts on the way forward, sir,
- [01:06:13] **Itamar Marcus:** I'll start with, with where you, led to there with dealing with the Palestinians. We have shown, numerous times that is Palestinian watch.

- [01:06:21] I've been in parliaments. I can't even count the number of times. And when members of parliament and members of governments, see the material with their own eyes, they are very, much shocked by it. They're very much moved by it. and my, biggest frustration is that over the years, the Israeli, the Israeli government, has used it very, they've used it, they use it a lot.
- [01:06:42] They, talk about the salaries to terrorists and other things that we've exposed. They talk about the school books, but they don't, they talk about it in general. They don't go into the details. One of the things that, that we have to do to change. Some of these European countries, I think we have to embarrass them.
- [01:06:56] We have to shame them for supporting the Palestinian [01:07:00] authority. they have to be shamed because how can you support, an entity that if you look on our website, we've reported this repeatedly seven times in the last year. The Palestinian Authority official TV station had sermons on Friday where the religious figures, including religious leaders, sharia judges, said, count the Jews one by one.
- [01:07:20] Kill them one by one. Don't leave even one. And then go to them and say, here you are paying for this. You are giving the Palestinian authority money. You are paying the salaries of these people. Why can you do this? we recently published, a whole series of videos as part of a larger report that we're doing on how Palestinian authorities schools celebrated October 7th in public assemblies.
- [01:07:40] And you've got these little children, 10, 11, 12 year olds reading these poems about how they woke up to this day that they thought was a dream. They didn't know this could ever happen. And they go on and on one school after the other. Shame these people, shame Macron publicly. In other words, don't just say.
- [01:07:58] I Israel's said [01:08:00] repeatedly, recognizing a Palestinian state is a, reward for terror. Now that's true, but that is a fraction of the problem. You have to shame these people. look what you've paid for it. Look what you're doing. And I'm hoping that, and, with the belief that if they're shamed, publicly by Israel because of the details of what they're supporting, it could make, it could make a difference.
- [01:08:20] And I'll just say one 30 seconds more to follow up on what David was talking about. Absolutely right. That we have to have a total victory. but I think we're much, much closer to total victory with, Gaza, which we still have to achieve, but we're much closer, even if we're at a war to end today, than we are to, what happened in Iran that we didn't complete the job in Iran is gonna be.
- [01:08:45] we'll be paying for this for I don't know how many years, today. Today there was an article on a major shipment of MIGS from Russia to, to Iran, just so in the Jerusalem Post a few hours ago. together with new air defense systems. [01:09:00] Why we can be sure that the Iranians learned from our attacks.
- [01:09:05] They're analyzing, they're trying to figure out, they're getting the latest planes, the latest jet fighters, and they're getting, putting in a new anti-aircraft

system. We should be bombing them tomorrow and finishing them off somehow. But incredibly we stopped too early and we will pay for that dearly, in the long run.

- [01:09:23] **Frank Gaffney:** Yeah, couldn't agree more. And this is one of the reasons why a central focus of the work of this Victory Coalition, and I think, Israel 365 action is as, several of you have observed, the imperative of decisive victory over. Israel's enemies and, ours, whom they are fighting, brilliantly.
- [01:09:43] Daniel Greenfield. final comments from you, sir?
- [01:09:46] **Daniel Greenfield:** Oh, I think those are all very important points that need to be made, but the larger question of what we can do, I think, is we need to pursue all of them. Certainly, we need to pursue the different levels. To whatever extent we can influence [01:10:00] governments, we should, to whatever extent we can, spread the narrative that this is a larger conflict, within Islam with Western civilization, and not just with Western civilization.
- [01:10:08] But, a point I've made over and over again is that Muslims are currently at war with Jews, with Christians, with Hindu, with Buddhists. If you name a religion that has, anybody is at all aware of, There's good odds that Muslims are persecuting that religion at war with it in conflict with it. So this is very much a global religious just war rather than, the swan gimmick where they take some of the folk Deutsche that were rough behind and Israeli territory after the wars and, pretend that they're in the pressed minority.
- [01:10:36] So we definitely need to push back against that. We need to absolutely demonstrate, that yes, tomorrow Marcus' work is very vital. For showing that there is absolutely no peace partner on the other side, that the other side wants nothing but conflict. We also need to deal with the hypocrisy and the double dealing of these people who claim to advocate politically, culturally, for the state.
- [01:10:58] They're not doing this for their [01:11:00] stated reasons. None of them are doing this for their stated reasons. They're doing it for entirely other reasons, whether it's antisemitism, whether it's cowardice about their own internal conflicts, whether it's wishful thinking, whether it's the need to solve some sort of paradigm, whether it's resentment of Israel, but they're not doing this for the stated reasons.
- [01:11:16] There are very few people who are at all involved in any of this, who have any awareness of this, and then come away thinking that a Palestinian state is a viable solution. So rather than playing defense, which we unfortunately do quite a bit in explaining why this, state is a very bad idea and why Israel really does not deserve to be slandered in this way.
- [01:11:35] A lot of which frankly is, Those into our own very own echo chamber. we need to make the case aggressively. Why? First of all, creating such a St. State is going to destabilize the region. It's going to destabilize the world. That's something we haven't really sufficiently talked about, but there's certainly plenty of history behind this idea.

- [01:11:52] we've seen the damage that has blooded in its dominance of Lebanon. we've seen the damage that the Palestinians, the PLO did when it was, [01:12:00] able to cause that kind of damage in Jordan and Lebanon. So creating a state will first of all destabilize the region. It will also destabilize the world.
- [01:12:08] we've seen the outbursts of violence in the United States, and parts of the west over, Against Israel, but also against these governments. And if these governments think that the violence is going to die down, that it's going to go away, they are very sadly mistaken. If anything, the violence will upsurge it will get worse.
- [01:12:26] And that is really what creating the state would do. It will create the instability, will create violence across the region and around the world. And those people who support it have to be asked why they support creating violence and instability in the region and around the world.
- [01:12:39] **Frank Gaffney:** Amen. thank you, gentlemen, for an extraordinary, presentation series of presentations program, writ large.
- [01:12:48] I guess I would just close with a final thought. I don't think anyone has made this observation, but, it's sufficiently self-evident that I, figured this out. We've had a [01:13:00] Palestinian state that would be Gaza under Hamas. It is exactly what is to be expected in any other subsequent arrangement.
- [01:13:11] Whether it is under the nominal, control of, the supposed good guys, who aren't so good, or, some new branded version of Hamas. It will be more of the same, more jihad, more death to Israel, more death to America, and a proxy for the others, in the region and beyond, who seek exactly those outcomes as well.
